Indigenous People & IWRM

The participation of vulnerable groups is essential for the sustainability of water management solutions. Indigenous people's ability to participate fully in sustainable development practices on their lands is limited by economic, social and historical factors. In view of the sustainable development of the natural environment, as well as the cultural, social, economic and physical well-being of indigenous peoples, efforts must be made to recognize, promote and strengthen the role of indigenous communities in water management systems. The Integrated Water Resources Management (IWRM) approach seeks to enhance dialogue between different stakeholders and favours decision-making at the lowest appropriate institutional level.

This course aims to teach how to integrate traditional knowledge into policies and practices in IWRM, and discuss ways to enhance indigenous people's participation in sustainable water management and development.

The course is open to a maximum of 40 participants representing various stakeholders group from the entire water sector
